New Rolling Stones Documentary Gets Fall Release



Even though the Rolling Stones recently **stated** there wouldn't be a 50th anniversary tour for this year, the legendary British rock group will still celebrate the achievement in the forms of

other media releases. Following Thames & Hudson's official, authorized photo book titled *The Rolling Stones: 50* on July 12, this September, Eagle Rock Entertainment will release a new documentary tracing the Rolling Stones' constant evolution since 1963.

Brett Morgen will direct the as of yet-unnamed film, which will feature never-before-seen, uncensored footage of the band on the road and in the studio recovered from historical archives and personal documents. Morgen, who has also directed such films as *The Kid Stays In The Picture* and an ESPN *30 For 30* documentary stated, "This is the film that will defy convention and create a sonic tapestry to transport viewers into the world of the Rolling Stones."

He continued, "The film will deliver the original, bold, sexy and dangerous flavor of the iconic rock band."
