Eagles of Death Metal's return to Paris captured in new concert movie

Eagles Of Death Metal's emotional return to Paris, France after the violence that marred the band's Bataclan gig in 2015 is to be released as a concert movie.

The group's 13 November, 2015 French show ended abruptly when gunmen entered the Bataclan Theatre and opened fire. Almost 90 people were killed in the horror event.

Jesse Hughes and his bandmates returned to the city the following February (16) to complete their show as part of The Nos Amis Tour, performing at the Olympia Hall.

The gig was filmed and the subsequent concert film, *I Love You All The Time*, will be released on DVD and CD this summer (Aug17).

A spokesman for the band says, "This release encapsulates the pure emotion and intensity of that extraordinary Olympia concert and is dedicated to all those who lost their lives at the Bataclan." Before the show, Eagles of Death Metal co-founder and lead singer Hughes said, "The people of Paris have always been incredible to us, and our feeling of love towards this beautiful city and its people has been reinforced a million times over this past month. Hearing the stories of the survivors, the injured and those who have lost loved ones has been overwhelming. Not returning to finish our set was never an option."
