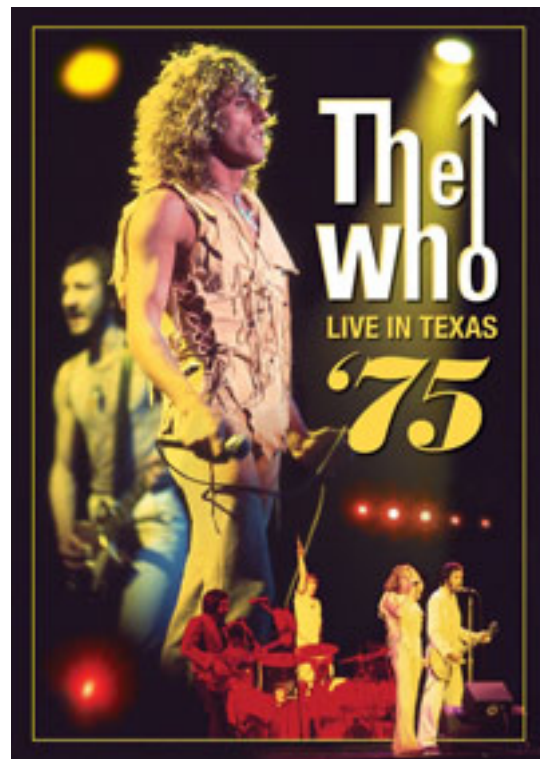

FMQB Retro-Active: Ken Sharp Talks To Angela Bowie About New Book and Reviews New Who DVD

WHO'S BEST... Always considered rock's most explosive live band, a new DVD, *The Who - Live in Texas '75* (Eagle Rock) reaffirms the group's mastery on the concert stage. Filmed on November 20, 1975 at The Summit in Houston, the tour, in support of the band's newly released album *Who by Numbers*, finds Messrs. Townshend, Daltrey, Moon and Entwistle at the top of their game. By this point, all save one song from their prior album, *Quadrophenia*, remained in the set. Instead, the band drew from their new album with a joyous romp through their latest single, "Squeeze Box," "Dreaming From the Waist" and a rare airing of "However Much I Booze." Drummer **Keith Moon** attacks the



drums like an escaped mental patient (and that's a good compliment), delivering equal doses of finesse and chaos as he blasts through the set. **Roger Daltrey's** voice is in prime form soaring to operatic heights. **John Entwistle**, silent and sturdy, displays a typically virtuoso performance, ripping off dazzling bass runs with ease. And the mighty engine behind this impressive live set is **Pete Townshend**, windmills and power chords, lighting the fuse behind their explosive fusillade of sound. *The Who - Live in Texas '75* is an electrifying look at rock's greatest live band in action.
